### ENGLISH LANGUAGE LAB – REPORT (June 2019- February 2020)

The significance of the language laboratory has been much felt in the domain of communication in our College curriculum. It is required of any learner to have a good command of the language for communication purposes, with clarity and accuracy being vital for effective and efficient communication. What helps one to acquire such proficiency in a language is the process and the method of learning that language. Our Language Lab abets students in practicing and assessing their communication skills effectively. Hence, the Lab functions from 8.30 am to 6.45 pm on ALL working days, where ALL the first year Under Graduate students are **Taught**, **Trained** and **Tested** in the most essential SKILLS – LISTENING, SPEAKING, READING and WRITING.

The objective of English Language Lab is to develop the language skills of the students with the help of the computer to teach language. There are THREE Labs with 120 computers in all to accommodate 120 students all at a time, and 03 control units to instruct and monitor the students. An additional lab with 30 terminals was established this year to house more students. All the labs function in the air conditioned environment. The language course materials are already fed into the computer and are displayed according to the features available in the system. The computers in the Language Lab are also connected to the Internet and at times it transforms into **Web Assisted Language Laboratory.** The electronic devices used in the laboratory stimulate the eyes and ears of the learner to acquire the language quickly and easily. The laboratory's collection is designed to assist learners in the acquisition and maintenance of aural comprehension, oral and written proficiency, and cultural awareness. The language laboratory is very useful for assessing students' speech. It provides students with the technical tools to get the best samples of pronunciation of the language. Hence, the English Language Lab is made mandatory for all the first year UG students as part of their Part II English programme. Students

attend the Language Lab class once a week in one of the Part II classes scheduled for them. At the end of each semester, they are subjected to aural, oral and written tests and undergo evaluation processes where the marks they secure are included in the CIA of the Part II paper.

## **OUTREACH ACTIVITIES: 2019 – 2020**

### **<u>1. A Five Day Workshop on "Communication Skills", Venue: Computer Aided Language</u> Laboratory (CALL), Date: 20 June 2019 to 24June 2019.**

A five-day workshop/training program on "Communication Skills" was organized by the Language Lab for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year under graduate students of the Department of English from 20 June 2019 to 24June 2019.

The English language, specifically, has urged the students to learn the art of communication who are career oriented. English language learning has along these lines acquired an unquestionable requirement for any

Indian understudy today. The Language Lab of Bishop Heber College opened its door to train the students of 2nd & 3rd Undergraduate English Students of Bishop Heber College from 20 June 2019 to 24June 2019.

Students underwent hands on training with live activities. 64 students of the second year programme and 77 students from third year improvised their language proficiency.
